## Chairman's Introduction – Spring 2021

Along with many other organisations, you will appreciate our ability to undertake any activities in the last year have been limited. However, our Planning Sub Group has continued to keep a close eye on all the applications submitted to Waverley Borough Council during the year (see report on page 5 ), and I would like to thank all those members who supported the ZOOM AGM which took place in November. It was good to 'see' you all there.

As for 2021, the Executive Committee is optimistic that some of our events will take place though all plans will be dependent on any Government guidelines or restrictions at the time and may need to be rescheduled at short notice. Indeed, we hope to restart our popular Town History walks in June and continue through to September and are very positive that some Heritage Open Days properties and tours can go ahead between 17-19 September. Certainly our participants are keen to open their properties if they can and we shall be looking to see how we can embrace the national theme of 'Edible England'.

Godalming, these days, is not known to be famous for having a food named after it but we have recently discovered The Godalming Biscuit – a funeral offering which was made locally and for which we are still to find a recipe. Also, in the 17C, the town was famous for its liquorice, carrots and fish and, of course, we have a strong brewing tradition. With these in mind and any other suggestions that are forthcoming, from you, our members, we are sure we are able to find links to the Edible theme. A number of you offered to help over Heritage Weekend in 2020 for which we were very grateful. This year we may well see the need for additional stewards in order to maintain any necessary social distancing etc. and, if so, I hope you are still happy for us to contact you.

The other event put on hold last year was the Civic Design Awards. There are a number of potential properties for the various categories and we hope that we can make some awards at our AGM, the date of which is Thursday 28 October 2021. Please let Colin Swait know of any

building or 'town scape improvement scheme' that you think should be included for consideration.

As I have previously mentioned your Committee is concerned about the future of The Godalming Trust as the past year without any activities has limited our profile and the opportunity to attract new members or increase the Committee. We do really need new ideas and activities. I hope that those who did express an interest in joining the Committee will still be interested, but we felt with so little happening it was not constructive to include them in our ZOOM meetings as this would not be representative of our annual events and need for assistance. We would still like to hear from anyone interested in working with the Committee in either a formal or informal role.

### **Treasurer's Report**

### **Planning Committee Report**

I am grateful to my committee who are, Bridget Bagnall, Mike Poulter and myself with Pam Talbot joining us from time to time.

We meet regularly, every three weeks, and review planning applications submitted to Waverley Borough Council.

On most occasions this year we have reviewed online when there has been little to discuss but still researched fully and during the present crisis, this is what we shall continue to do.

Since the AGM , we have reviewed the various applications and have recently been concerned on the size and scale of the Mole Country Stores in Brighton Road(Erection of 2 buildings and alterations to

existing listed building to provide 53 assisted living units) although not the principal of this type of development in this location.

We have also objected to the latest Westbrook Mills application applying for Outline permission for a 67 unit retirement scheme (including 30% affordable) with all matters reserved including new vehicular exit and associated parking and landscaping. This is in the Green Belt and on the flood plain..





**‘Place, where the heart is’.** Michael Blower, 2020 published by The Blower Foundation.

A few weeks ago I was delighted to receive a copy of the above book from the author. It is a charming publication by the well-known architect, Michael Blower, comprising sketches of Godalming made over 60 years, along with architectural notes and quotes from a poem ‘The White Cliffs’ by Alice Duer Miller.

Michael was a founder member of The Godalming Trust but although he moved to Farnham in the 1970s he continued to visit and sketch Godalming.

The front cover shows Michael’s idea for the pedestrianisation of Church Street made in 1967. It also has his designs for a ‘town cross’ and an April fool’s joke published in the Farnham Herald showing the Pepperpot moved to Castle Street Farnham! All through the book are pen and ink and watercolour sketches, along with observations and notes by the artist.

It is privately published by The Blower Foundation for Cultural Connection and is not available commercially, although the book itself says it is published both in hard copy and on line I have been unable to find the on line version so far. The website is [www.blowerfoundation.org](http://www.blowerfoundation.org) where it says there is an on-going project to add his sketchbooks etc so perhaps by the time you read this review the book may be available on line. The author was also planning to donate a copy to Godalming Museum Library when it reopened.
