

Saturday 8th / Sunday 9th

Visits by coach to three fascinating buildings all dating from the end of the 19th century. Each tour goes to two of the buildings and takes about 3 hours, with a fair amount of walking, steps and stairs. **Tickets £5** from the Museum to cover transport costs – see back page for further details.

The Red House (RH)

Designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens for a master at Charterhouse. Steeply sloping site with Georgian appearance at street level and castlelike elevation from below. Visitors will see progress of restoration work by the present owners.

Munstead Grange (MG)

Designed by Edward W Mountford, architect of The Old Bailey. Visitors will see progress of restoration work recently started on the Gertrude Jekyll garden.

Prior's Field School (PFS)

Designed by Charles Voysey and acquired in 1901 by Leonard and Julia Huxley for a "high class school for girls". Garden influenced by Gertrude Jekyll. Visitors will see the house, garden, school and new "Voysey" sports hall.

The Parish Church of St Peter & St Paul has architectural features from each of the last twelve centuries. **3.45 pm - tour of Church** including bell tower, then **tea** hosted by the Friends of St Peter & St Paul, and **Evensong at 6.30pm**.

Godalming Museum

The Museum houses over 8000 items recording the rich history of the town. **Open 10am to 5pm** throughout the Heritage Open Days. Refreshments served all day. Use the Museum as your base for exploring Godalming. The Museum is at 109a High Street. **Number 1 on the map**.

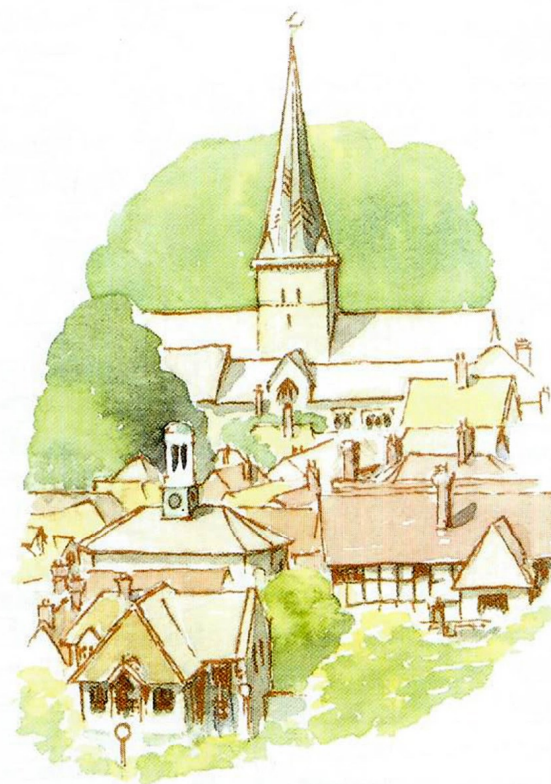

By train Godalming is on the Waterloo-Portsmouth Harbour direct line. **By bus** Godalming is well served by buses from Guildford, Farnham and many local villages. **By road** Godalming is signposted off the A3 and A31. It is reached from Guildford by the A3100. Pay and display car parks are shown on the map overleaf.

Saturday Town Centre Events

All town centre attractions (except the guided walk) are open from 10am until 4pm and all are free of charge. Numbers in brackets relate to the map.

Buildings open

3 Church Street (The Nye Saunders John Deal Partnership)

(3) An oak-framed former town house built around 1600, jettied on two storeys with ogee curved braces. **Guided tours at 10am, 11am, noon, 1pm, 2pm and 3pm.** No admission between these times.

Church House (Barlows Solicitors) (5)

Dating from the late Middle Ages, the house has some fine 16th century and Victorian features, including timber framing and a magnificent staircase. **Guided tours at 10am, 11am, noon, 1pm, 2pm and 3pm.** No admission between these times.

Mill Lane Studio (7)

A 19th century building, used originally for the manufacture of hosiery, now houses the workshop of historical costumier Ninya Mikhaila, whose faithfully reproduced costumes are displayed at Hampton Court.

14 Croft Road (10)

Listen to the mechanical music of a remarkable collection of Church and Chamber barrel organs dating from the period 1765 to 1830. **Visits at 10am, 11am, noon, 1pm, 2pm and 3pm.** As only twelve people can be accommodated at one time it is essential to **book at the Museum.**

Guided walk around the town

The perfect way to discover hidden Godalming. Just turn up at the **Pepperpot at 2.30pm.** The walk lasts about one-and-a-half hours. (Another will take place on Sunday at 10.30am – also starting at the Pepperpot.)
