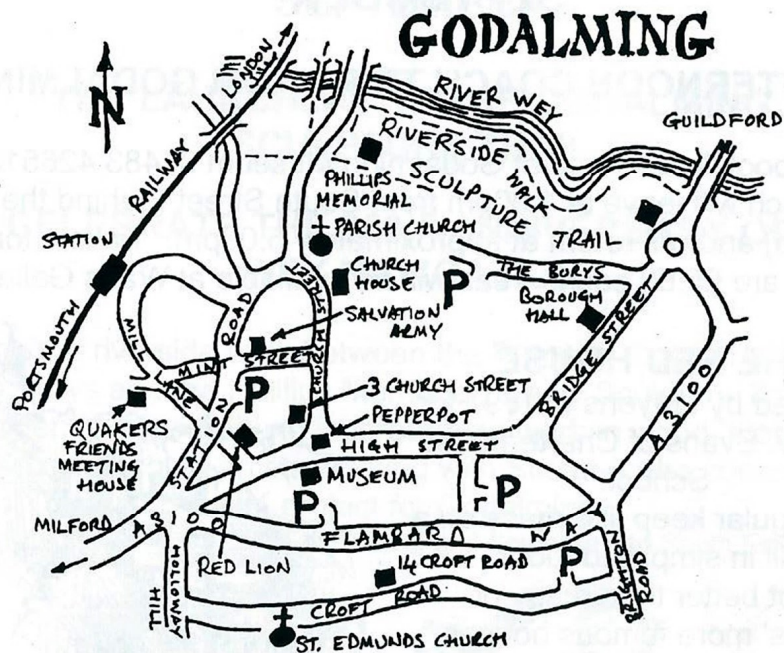

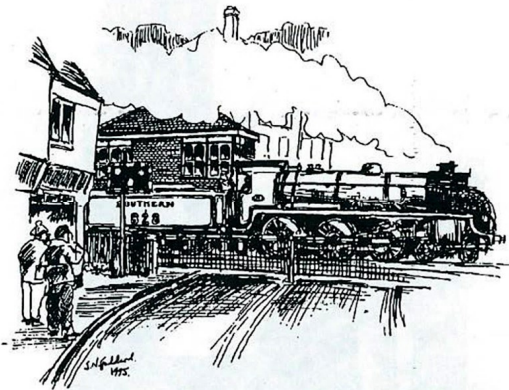
THURSDAY 11TH SEPTEMBER

SATURDAY 13TH SEPTEMBER

14 CROFT ROAD

Listen to the mechanical music of a remarkable collection of church and chamber barrel organs dating from 1765 to 1830.

Visits at 11.00am, 12.00 noon, 1.00pm, 2.00pm and 3.00pm.

As only 15 people can be accommodated at one time it is essential to book at Godalming Museum.



SATURDAY 14TH SEPTEMBER

CHURCH HOUSE (Barlows Solicitors)

Dating from the Middle Ages this house also has some fine 16th century and Victorian features, including timber framing and a magnificent staircase. GUIDED TOURS at 10.00am, 12.00 noon, 2.00pm and 3.00pm. Admission by ticket only, available from the museum.



3 CHURCH STREET (The Nye Saunders John Deal Partnership)

An oak framed former town house built around 1600. Jettied on two stories with ogee carved braces.

GUIDED TOURS at 10.00am, 11.00am, 2.00pm and 3.00pm.

Admission by ticket only, available from the museum.

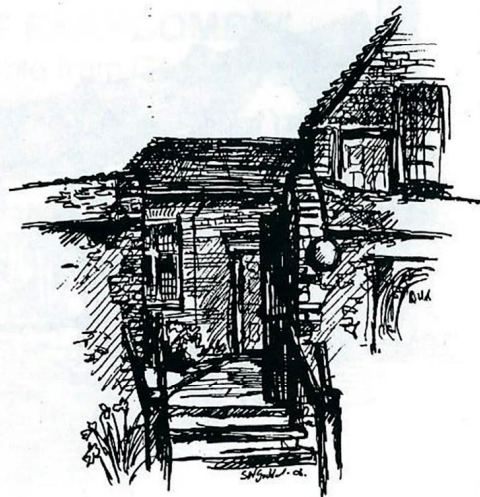


SATURDAY 13TH SEPTEMBER

QUAKERS, FRIENDS MEETING HOUSE

Dating back to the 17th Century. Two buildings on Caleb Wood's land were given over for the use of the Quakers in the early 1700s. Title deeds of 1715 refer to a meeting house for Quakers; they still welcome you today in this historic building.

Open 10.30am till 5.00pm to look around, refreshments of tea and biscuits are offered for a donation.



RED LION, MILL LANE

With its history recently researched, this pub was used by court judges during the 18th century and the public bar was built as an Oddfellows Hall in 1843 and later used as the Grammar School (where Jack Phillips, the radio officer on the Titanic was educated). As well as being an interesting building it has served its community as a pub for many years, as it still does.

SATURDAY 13TH SEPTEMBER

THE SALVATION ARMY

Built in the 1830s originally for the Congregationalists, who sold it in 1848 to the Methodists, the building transferred to the Salvation Army in 1903. There will be an exhibition celebrating their centenary at this site, and a book will be available for sale.

Open 10.00am to 4.00pm



ST EDMUNDS CHURCH

Dating from 1906, Godalming's Catholic Church is a solid building of local stone which sits on a hillside to allow its short spire's tip to be higher than that of the Parish church of St. Peter and St. Paul, thus nearer to God. Well that's the story anyway!

Open after Mass (Mass is 9.30 – 10.30am) all day.

Also Mass on Sunday at 6.00pm.



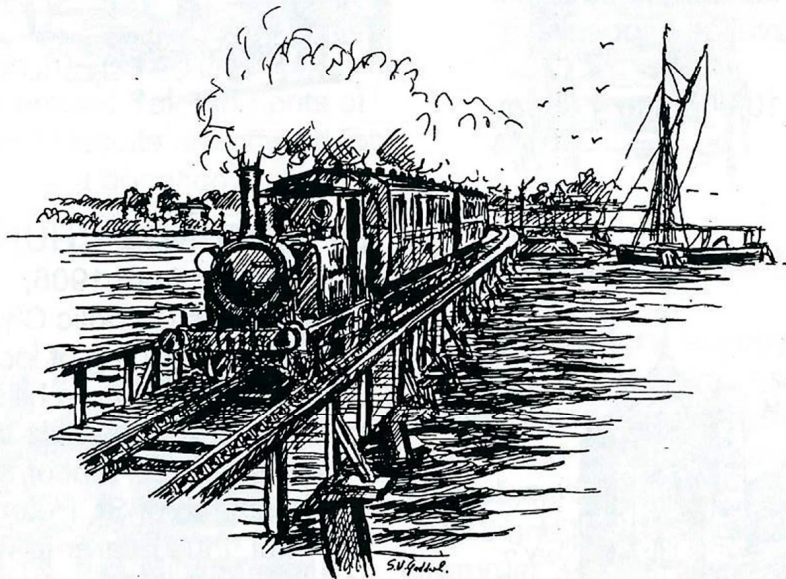

PARISH CHURCH OF ST PETER AND ST PAUL

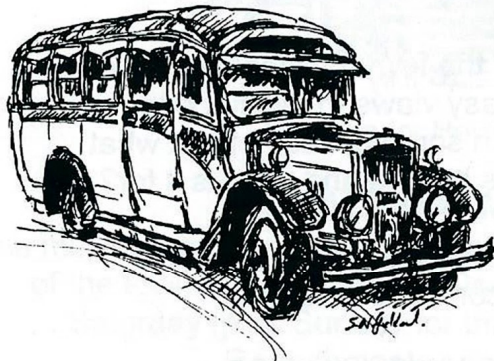

GODALMING – Meaning of the family or clan of Godhelm, was established as a Saxon settlement in the seventh century AD. First recorded in the will of King Alfred the Great in 899, by the time of Domesday (1086) it was a thriving town with three watermills.

Designed by Lutyens in 1897 for the Rev. Evans of Charterhouse School.

WATTS GALLERY, COMPTON

The gallery holds a fascinating collection of the works of the eminent Victorian artist and leading light of the Arts and Crafts Movement, G.F.Watts.



**WATTS CHAPEL,
COMPTON**

This richly decorated and unusual terracotta chapel was designed by Mary Watts, wife of G.F.Watts and built in 1898 with the help of the villagers of Compton.
