Details are correct at time of going to press, any changes will be posted at the Pepperpot and the Museum on the weekend.

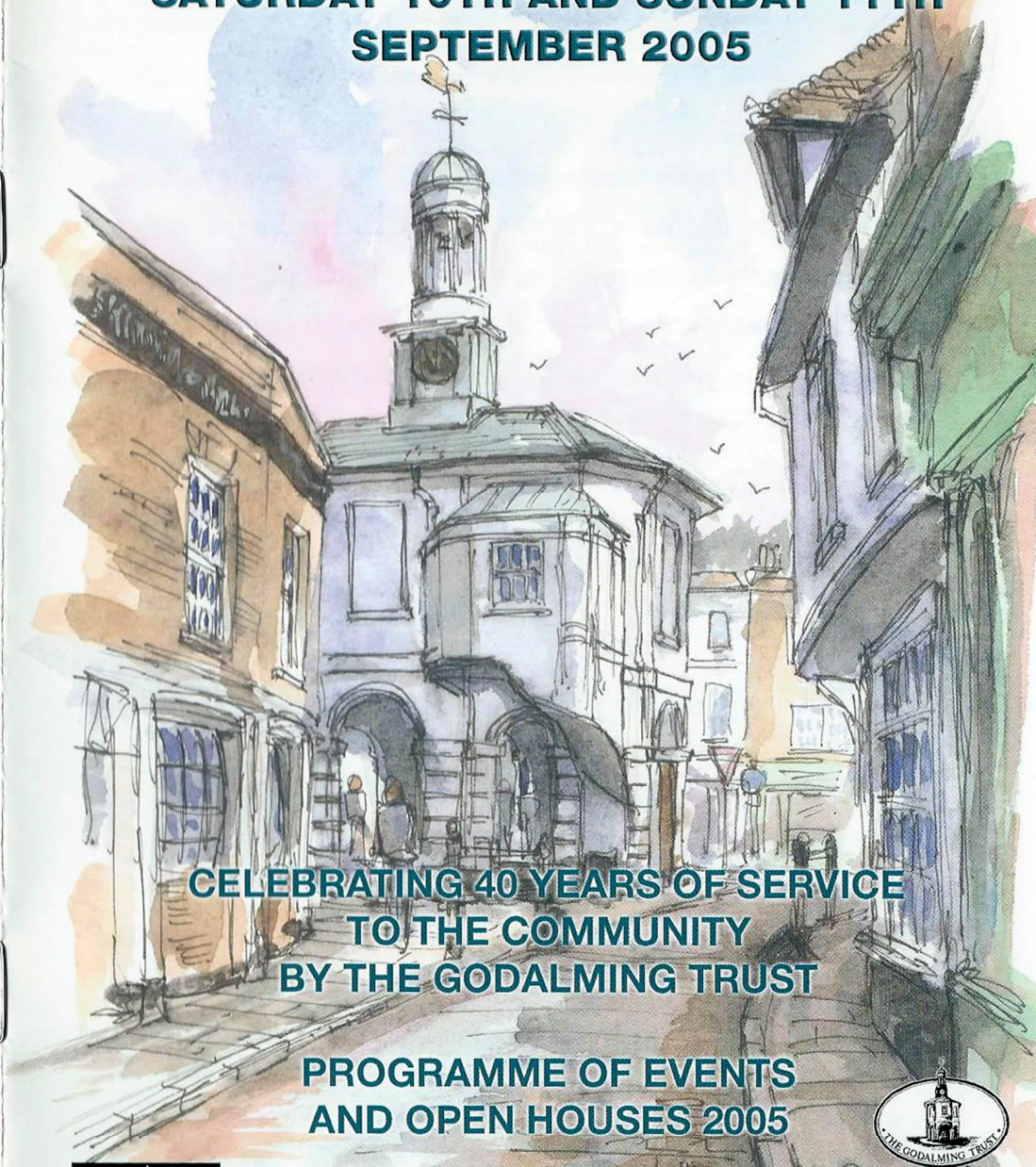

### SATURDAY 10TH AND SUNDAY 11TH

#### THE PEPPERPOT

Built by public subscription in 1814 to replace the mediaeval ruinous structure, designed by local architect John Perry, the Pepperpot is Godalming's old Market House and Town Hall.

It has survived attempts by the council to knock it down for road improvements to become the "trademark" of Godalming. Upstairs gives a great vantage point to see the High Street, plus there is the exhibition "The Portsmouth Road And The Sea" for Heritage weekend.

#### GODALMING MUSEUM, 109A HIGH STREET

Over 12,000 items record the history of Godalming including some of the town's personalities such as Gertrude Jekyll, Edwin Lutyens, Winston Churchill and Jack Phillips. Don't miss the fine garden and summerhouse. Over Heritage Open Days and beyond (August 30th till September 17th) an exhibition celebrates the 40th anniversary of the Godalming Trust.

#### PARISH CHURCH OF ST PETER AND ST PAUL

Open as usual SATURDAY 10TH, but on SUNDAY 11TH there are special events

4.00pm TOUR OF THE CHURCH by the Rev. Canon John Ashe, when the bells will be rung. **ADMISSION BY TICKET ONLY**, available from Godalming museum.

6.30pm CHORAL EVENSONG led by Canon John Ashe using the 1549 book of Common Prayer.

8.00pm CONCERT of music by WARLOCK, VAUGHAN WILLIAMS and DAVID STONE.

#### UNITARIAN CHAPEL, MEADOW

This dissenting chapel opened in 1789 at a time when nonconformist churches were "underground" practicing in secret. The chapel has a full immersion baptistry.

#### No. 3 CHURCH STREET

#### The Nye Saunders Partnership

An oak framed former town house built around 1600.

Jettied on two storeys with ogee curved braces.

### CHURCH HOUSE, CHURCH STREET

#### Barlow Robbins Solicitors

Dating from the Middle Ages with 16th century and Victorian features, including timber framing and a magnificent staircase.

### THE RED LION, MILL LANE

Used by court judges during the 18th century, the public bar was built as the Oddfellows Hall in 1843 and later became the Grammar school, where Jack Phillips of Titanic fame was educated.

### THE SALVATION ARMY CHAPEL, MINT STREET

Built in the 1830s it became the Salvation Army Chapel in 1903.

### QUAKERS' FRIENDS MEETING HOUSE, THE MINT

These buildings have been the home to the Quakers since the early 1700s. Refreshments of tea and biscuits will be offered for a donation.

### ST. EDMUNDS CHURCH, CROFT ROAD

Godalming's Catholic church built of local bargate stone in 1906; being on a hill its weather cock is slightly higher than that of the parish church (near to God?)

### FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST SCIENTIST, OCKFORD ROAD

1930s church designed by Paul Phipps (Joyce Grenfell's father) where, like Guildford Cathedral, building was interrupted during the Second World War. The organ will be played.

### FARNCOMBE INFANT SCHOOL, GRAYS ROAD

An open day to celebrate 100th Anniversary this year, including an exhibition of the school's history and guided tours of the school plus refreshments.
